The second grade students will read about adventures in the story "Jingle Dancer." The spelling words are words with mid- and miss- prefixes. We will be talking about Celebrations as the students celebrate the end of the school year. The entire 2nd grade has made tremendous gains in Spelling and Reading. It is always a good idea to keep learning over the summer.

Please visit your local library to check out books. They should read over the summer and most of the students are ready for chapter books. It's really fun to see how many you can read in a week! Most libraries have a summer reading program with awards for the children. I recommend all students join the Summer program at the IMC Public Library. See the sign-up sheet for programs on the back page of this newsletter.

Also, please practice addition and subtraction facts. Students need to keep their skills sharp in "borrowing" and "carrying." Please practice counting forward and backward to 100 and even farther. To prepare for 3rd grade, we recommend you work with your child on addition and subtraction. This would be a great time to teach them about earning an allowance. Have them count money and tell you how much change relates to a given amount.

Check out your child's "100 Things To Do" list that we are creating right now. It will give you 100 free or cheap things to do on a beautiful summer day.

Make sure your child brings in the slip asking about measurements for uniforms. We want everyone to get their free uniform for next year.

FIFTH GRADE


